

### Change social behavior


User education


Help users identify legal content

## Support anti-piracy innovation

- FCC should encourage anti-piracy innovation and use
- NSF should sponsor anti-piracy research

# Encourage coordinated industry action

- Encourage stakeholders to develop best practices and collaborative self-regulation regimes
- e.g. graduated response system by ISPs
- Identify sites engaged in piracy so industry can block, remove ads, and stop payments

# Pursue international frameworks to protect IP

- Hold nations responsible for the data flowing out of their networks
- Build global partnerships to form coordinated response to piracy
